Yard Waste Official Notice



Please be aware that the large green bin at the upper entrance of Sonoma Pines is no longer available for yard waste and landscape debris.

If you have any yard waste (trimmings) that you need removed, please BAG the trimmings and leave the bag at the end of your driveway on MONDAYs. United Landscapes will remove the properly bagged trimmings on that day only.

Please do not leave yard waste bags out on any other day.

And here's a comment:

It is funny how some of our residents figured it out while others continued to dump their household garbage at the front entrance.

This is a note from one resident to APM, "We are concerned that some of the residents in Sonoma Pines do not respect our lovely area. The people who dumped their refuse at the front entrance are very disturbing to the rest of us. The big green bin was available in April for everyone to dispose of their yard refuse. After it was removed residents continued to dispose of their garbage. I cannot call it refuse now as there were household items in the pile.

A very wonderful resident, Darrell Bellamy, took it upon himself to make several trips to the dump to dispose of the huge amount of stinky, wet garbage. Last week some residents took their time to beautify the front entrance by planting flowers and shrubs but the same week some people disposed of their garbage a few feet away. There was more than one person who did this as the pile grew each day. This should not be tolerated".

Alteration Requests - Where Do I Find One?

If you are planning to do some alterations to the exterior of your residence you need to apply to SPHOA for approval to complete these alterations. To find the request you can go to www.sonomapines.info.

On the menu at the top of the page, under Council you will find an alteration request form. Please print and fill in the form and forward it by any means convenient to you to Greg Bickert at:

Greg will provide all Council members with a copy and the alteration request will be reviewed at the Council meeting following your submission. Council meets on the first Thursday of each month.

We may or may not be familiar with your home design so *please* make sure that you attach architectural drawings and photos that make it easy for us to envision your plans. Also keep in mind that if we do have questions there may be a delay in approval so it is wise to submit the request well in advance of the construction start date.

Please also make sure that you read the Owner Alterations Policy and Procedure which is part of the document as this outlines additional requirements regarding building permits and approved building tradespeople to complete the modifications.
