

2015 has been a very busy year for council with Sonoma Pines continuing to be the toast of the Okanagan Valley. Our volunteer spirit is outstanding and every resident should be grateful for the commitment of those actively involved in the operation of our community.

We were successful in completing an RFP for a landscaping and irrigation contractor and think the community will be well served having Asahi back under contract. The Landscaping Committee was very active at introducing new landscaping guidelines, pruning specs and an acceptable species list.

The Maintenance Committee successfully introduced a new Alteration Process that detailed the acceptable specifications including the forms necessary for home owners to secure approval. The committee was responsible for getting the catch basins and our gutters cleaned and putting a process in place for single family homes to take advantage of our contract rates. They also refined the processes around general community maintenance that has simplified much of how our community operated into the future. They are currently working through our

depreciation report and many of our maintenance standards for the future. The Welcoming Committee was introduced late in the year and has been very successful at bring an information package to new owners and providing a means for them be comfortable in our community.

The Social Committee continues to be active and each new social event seems to be better than the last. There were many events throughout the year with the New Year's Eve event showing that there are many in our community that are prepared to dance past the midnight hour.

The Clubhouse Committee has been very active at working with the Social Committee to ensure many projects are completed without any draw on strata funds. The shuffleboard, lighting, kitchen shutters are examples of the projects brought forward through the cooperation of these two committees.

The Finance Committee continues to be the custodians of our financial welfare and have introduced a series of process and to help manage our operations and budgets. They are currently working through the budget preparation for next year and looking at possible cost allocation models that we could consider in the future.

The Communication Committee successfully produced a monthly newsletter that has been very well received. They have updated our WEB site and introduced Facebook as additional tools to help keep our residents informed and up to date. They are currently working on new tools that will simplify and manage our distribution.

An Administrative Advisory Committee was introduced at the end of the year with a key objective to help with the selection of a Community Services Coordinator to be our onsite resource and assist with the processes and document management practices for Sonoma Pines.

Council has been in constant discussion with APM regarding the service levels we are experiencing and as a result APM introduced Kevin Jersey as our new replacement property manager in November. Council will continue to work with APM to ensure the service level expectations that were agreed to in June are being met.

Finally there has been significant attention to the transition as Rykon is expecting to be complete in late May 2016. Council has met with Carrington regarding the next steps and has also met with WestBank First Nations to ensure our collective understanding of both the documentation and processes are clear. Expect to be in a position at our May AGM to have Carrington transition the corporate directorship to the sitting council of the Sonoma Pines Home Owners Association.

# Snow Removal Update

It looks like we have managed to survive

our first series of snowfalls and Council would like to address one of the issues that has come up.

We have received some emails regarding the issue of snow being pushed onto lawns and boulevards throughout the community.

As there is not a lot of spare room in Sonoma Pines for piling or "storage" of snow, much of it has ended up on boulevards or lawns. Given current circumstances, Council considers this the most reasonable option until the snow melts.

If these piles become too large we will resort to trucking excess snow out of the community, however, snow removal entails additional expenses related to rental of trucks and fees to dump the snow. We hope to avoid incurring additional snow removal expenses.

If you are concerned about damages to fences, or sprinkler heads, our contract with Interior Snow Removal calls for those being repaired come Spring. Please bring any damage to the attention of Associated Property Management at <u>sonomapines@associatedpm.ca</u> and we will ensure it is taken care of. We greatly appreciate your patience and understanding.

A great mix of youth all the way up to us seniors. We arrived to unseasonably hot weather with 30+ temperatures every day. Everyone got their fair share of sunshine. The guys had no problem filling their days as we were greeted with the daunting task of building 46 foot trusses (without a plan I might add), then carrying them about 100 yards up the hill where we had to lift them onto the roof, all by hand. We were fortunate to be able to work along side of the locals who prove to be a very tough and resilient people. We were able to get all the trusses in place on the new home for the elderly in preparation for the next group to come in and complete the metal sheeting.

The gals also filled their days providing helping hands at the orphanage, school, medical center, teen home, elderly home, and soup kitchen. As you can see from the picture, it didn't take long to make special connections with the little ones. They are like little sponges, soaking up all of the learning and loving that could be provided.
