A WATCHFUL **BEST BURGLAR ALARM!**

Very pleased to say that we now have committed block Watch Captains and Co-Captains for all of our community streets in Sonoma Pines with ONE exception "SIRINGO LANE!"

A FEW SIMPLE WAYS TO **DISCOURAGE BREAK-INS GET POLICE ASSISTANCE**

Police can help you stop crime before it happens - report strange vehicles or strange persons hanging around. Call police if you have been broken into or have something stolen from your yard. If you hear anything please call the police. RCMP-250-768-2880 or Westbank First Nation Law enforcement 250-717-6147. Please call 911 if a crime is in progress.

DON'T SHOWBOAT

Leaving certain things in your yard can lure thieves. Do not leave your garage open or do not leave your car unlocked. If you have your curtains open and valuable items are in sight consider redesign to move those valuables out of sight.

TRICKING BURGLARS

If burglars suspect someone is home, there's a greater chance they will not attempt a break-in. Create an illusion someone is home. Leave lights on or music or the television. Perhaps put a home security system sign in your yard or window.

KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOURS

Getting to know the people you live around is one of the most important safety steps you can take. Closer-knit neighbourhoods generally report fewer break-in because strangers will stick out. **LOCK IT UP**

40 % of break-ins happen without force. Do not leave doors or windows unlocked. Always lock the deadbolt. Double-check

patio and sliding doors to ensure they are **NEIGHBOUR IS YOUR** locked and can withstand kicks. Ensure you always close your garage door and lock the man door from the garage. **DON'T LEAVE A SPARE KEY OUT**

> Someone may watch you retrieve a key that's hidden under the mat or flower pot. Consider using a combination lock box you can hide somewhere outside.

> Thank you Block Watch Captain volunteers for stepping up to help our community be a safer place to live. We do this by looking out for one another.

Gardeners Corner

We are the stewards of the health of our trees in Sonoma Pines. When the trees were planted, plastic tarp and rocks were placed in the tree wells creating an unsuitably hot environment for the tree roots. This landscape method has created stress on the trees and is now evident especially after last winter's chilling cold and the heat of this summer. It now falls to us to restore and maintain the health of the trees.

Arborists recommend we ask all homeowners to remove the rocks and cut away the plastic tarp around the base of the tree to the edge of the plastic ring leaving the tree ring in place.

We are advised to replace the rocks with a good quality mulch such as Glenmore Grow or Ogoogo Grow. Please do not replace the rocks with plastic mulch. We are hoping that each street will organize with their neighbours to remove the rocks and place the surplus into areas where you already have rocks.

We are very pleased to see that many of our homeowners have already done this activity. For those homeowners that unable to complete this request, the community will organize a group in the



future to continue to remove the rocks from the tree wells. Please remove the rocks as soon as possible.

"It's not the tree well that's going to kill them, it's covering up the established root system that's going to do them in."
