#### Accidents Continue While Government Delays 4 Way Stop Again

By now, we're supposed to have a new 4 way stop at the corner of Sonoma Pines Drive and Carrington Road. As no construction had started by the end of September, a letter was sent to MLA, Ben Stewart asking for his assistance and

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clarification as to some of the plans. You can see a copy of letter dated October 2 here.

Subsequently, Mr. Stewart's office contacted me to say that there will be another delay in Ministry of Transport plans to install a 4 way stop at the intersection of Carrington Road and Sonoma Pines Drive. The MOT actual

response was that they "would revisit the project next year." When asked what revisit meant specifically, no one from Mr. Stewarts office had asked that question. As a matter of fact, none of the questions submitted in the letter of October 2 to MLA Stewart had even been asked.

For the newer residents of our community, this discussion goes back (at least) to 2012 when the head of Safety and Security wrote to Blair Lekstrom, then head of Ministry Of Transport, asking for a 4 Way Stop at the intersection due to the dangerous conditions for pedestrians and vehicles. These dangers have since been confirmed with recommendations for improvements made in an independent study of traffic conditions.

We await the answers to our questions. If in the meantime you'd like to express your opinion of the continued delays or would like to address MLA Stewart directly on this issue, he can be reached at Ben.Stewart.MLA@leg.bc.ca

If we allow these delays to go without comment from the community it could be a long time before we see any improvements.

#### Gardener's Corner

The end of the landscaping season has been signaled with the changes to the

community foliage.

The oval garden was a success this past year. The newly planted drought resistant plants thrived. The gardeners will continue to manage the garden and continue to decrease the amount of water necessary to have an attractive garden at the front of Sonoma Pines.

The Landscape Committee and the Irrigation and Water Conservation Committee were recently created and while each having their own responsibilities we will work together on many projects as they can be closely connected. The landscape group will focus on the trees and plants and ensuring all the common and multi areas look the best they can. Over the winter we plan to revise the approved plant list and the Red Stake program.

#### HOMEOWNERS' RESPONSIBILITIES FOR SNOW REMOVAL

 Sonoma Pines homeowners will be responsible for clearing snow from their driveway.

- Homeowners who happen to live in proximity of a street drain are asked to keep the drain cleared of snow to allow rain or melting snow to enter the drainage system.
- When clearing their driveways, homeowners can pile the snow on either side of it. Whenever possible, homeowner should pile snow to the right of the driveway (as you face the street) to reduce the potential of having it re-deposited at the driveway opening when the snow plow passes.
- Homeowners shall not shovel snow back onto the streets or sidewalks as this creates unsafe road conditions for motorists and may interfere with contractor's efforts to clear the roads.
- Rarely is the collection of trash and recyclables interrupted due to a winter storm so garbage bins, bundles and bags of recycling, will be kept on homeowner's driveway far enough from the road so that they are not dragged by the plow.
- Canada Post is responsible for providing access from the street or sidewalk to community mailboxes.
  However, considering the number of mailboxes they have to service, there might be delays. This is why it is customary for homeowners living in proximity of a mailbox to shovel an access path.

#### No Soliciting Policy or Canvassing By-Law Reminder

Sonoma Pines *No Soliciting or Canvassing By-law* (Division 1 Part 3 (12)) is in place to help safeguard our community especially during the winter months when a number of owners/residents vacate their homes to head south and other residents who are away at various times throughout the year. Bearing this in mind, it is very important for us to be aware of any solicitors or canvassers in our community.

Any persons found soliciting or canvassing should be asked to leave the property and told that this is <u>not</u> permitted in the Sonoma Pines community. Regardless of how worthy their cause may be (e.g. Girl Guide cookies), soliciting and canvassing are <u>not</u> permitted on Sonoma Pines property.

A *No Soliciting* sign is posted at the entry gates to Sonoma Pines.
